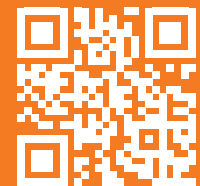

VIRGINIA FOLKLIFE AREA

Visit the **Appalachian Traditions** tent to meet artists and cultural organizations from Bristol and beyond! Located in southwest Virginia and closer to the capitals of six other states than to Richmond, Bristol straddles the VA and TN border. The US Congress designated Bristol as the birthplace of country music in recognition of the 1927 Bristol Sessions, during which The Carter Family, Jimmie Rodgers, and others were recorded for the first time. *The craft area is organized by the Virginia Folklife Program of Virginia Humanities.*
